Service Academy Nomination Information, Timeline, Worksheet & Application

Each year, Congressman Chris Smith works to ensure that the brightest, most highly motivated and wellqualified young adults from the Fourth Congressional District are made aware of, considered for, and nominated to the United States Service Academies. This packet includes important information that students, parents and educators need for a student to participate in Mr. Smith's nomination process.

General Information

PLEASE NOTE: The information below **does not** apply to the U.S. Coast Guard Academy, which does not require a congressional nomination. Students may apply directly to the Coast Guard Academy.

- 1. Each member of Congress handles nominations differently. This information is specific to Congressman Smith.
- 2. While parents, counselors, educators, and others may be involved in the application process, it is the responsibility of each individual <u>student</u> to compete for a nomination and admission to a Service Academy. We encourage students to take charge of their process—not their parents.
- 3. Attending a U.S. Service Academy has two separate but parallel paths: students must receive an offer of admission from the Academy <u>AND</u> receive a nomination. In other words, students must apply to the Academies just as they would any other college or university. Simultaneously, they must seek a nomination from their Member of Congress, U.S. Senators, and/or the Vice President or President of the United States. It is also possible under some circumstances to receive a nomination from a JROTC program. Students must complete <u>both</u> the nomination and admission processes.
- 4. Congressman Smith strongly encourages each applicant to pursue a nomination from *as many nominating sources as possible (i.e., your U.S. Senators, JROTC, etc., as well as from Congressman Smith.)*
- 5. Congressman Smith does not control nor participate in the admission processes at the Academies.
- 6. Part of the Academy application process includes being deemed physically and medically able to attend. It is the applicant's responsibility to seek out the necessary medical and physical examinations.
- 7. To be considered for a nomination, each applicant <u>must return his or her completed application packet in</u> <u>person or via trackable shipping by 4 pm on Friday, September 27, 2024, to:</u>

- 8. For an application to be considered complete, Congressman Smith's office must receive:
 - **<u>PHOTO</u>** A small <u>wallet-sized</u>, portrait-style color photograph of the applicant.
 - <u>APPLICATION FORM</u> see pages 4-5 of this guide.
 - <u>EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY INFO</u> Describing sports, clubs (both in and out of school), work history and any additional accomplishments. It is acceptable to include a resume in lieu of a list (see page 5 of this guide), but you must sign and return the second page of the application even if submitting a resume.
 - **<u>CONGRESSIONAL PERSONAL ESSAY</u>** From the applicant, approximately one-typed page in length, explaining why you are requesting a nomination from Congressman Smith.
 - <u>ACADEMY PERSONAL STATEMENT/ESSAY</u> A copy of the personal statement(s) or essay questions the applicant submitted online to each of the academies.
 - **TRANSCRIPT** An official high school transcript *with raised seal.* (*This can be sent directly to my office from the school if necessary.*)
 - <u>SCORES</u> A print-out of the applicant's SAT and/or ACT scores from the SAT/ACT website which includes the student's name. Additional updated scores may be submitted up until the interview date.
 - <u>**THREE RECOMMENDATION LETTERS**</u> At least three letters of recommendation, one of which must come from the student's principal, vice-principal, or guidance counselor. (*If you have already completed high school or attend a preparatory academy, please ask about appropriate letters of recommendation.*)
- 9. The Congressman's office contacts applicants via cell phone and email. Once you apply, <u>make sure you have</u> voice mail set up, it is cleared out and you check it.
- 10. Your permanent address must be in the Fourth Congressional District to apply to Congressman Smith. If you are not sure of your district, contact one of the Congressman's offices or visit house.gov and enter your zip code in the FIND YOUR REPRESENTATIVE box on the upper right corner.

Nomination Application Timeline

Date	Event	Actions
July	Rep. Smith's nominations application is available online	Students are encouraged to download the application and begin assembling documentation.
September 27, 2024 at 4:00 p.m.	Deadline for return of applications to Rep. Smith's Toms River office	Later SAT scores or additional letters of recommendation can be added up until December, <u>but</u> the application must be completed and returned by this date.
Mid November	Students receive a letter notifying of the date and time of her/his personal interview.	Personal interviews will be held with Rep. Smith's Service Academy Nomination Board. Students must email or call to confirm their interview appointment date and time.
December 7-8, 2024	Interviews with Advisory Board	Students must bring a print-out of first marking period grades and may also bring any updated test scores, awards, etc. that have not yet been submitted.
January 31, 2025	Rep. Smith makes nominations by this date	Students will be notified by letter when final nominations are made.
February-May 2025	Service Academies notify students if they receive an appointment	Students who did not receive a nomination, did not gain admission or both, may <u>reapply</u> until they are 22 years old.
June - July	Cadets & midshipmen report to academies	Future soldiers, sailors, airmen, marines, coastguardsmen & mariners begin military education.

Applicants will be notified in November regarding their specific interview date and time.
