17	cl	hological and physical abuse, including rape, beat-
18	in	ngs, confinement, and isolation from their families.
19		(4) The Government of Egypt has failed to
20	Cl	redibly investigate these allegations, creating a cli-

1	mate of impunity for the perpetrators of these
2	crimes and denying justice to the victims and their
3	families.
4	(5) The current political uncertainty in Egypt
5	has increased concerns as to whether the religious
6	freedom and other human rights of Coptic Chris-
7	tians will be respected and protected.
8	(b) Sense of Congress.—It is the sense of Con-
9	gress that the Administration should include the protec-
10	tion of Coptic Christian communities and respect for their
11	human rights as a priority in diplomatic engagements with
12	the Government of Egypt, including regular bilateral con-
13	sultations on the status of investigations, prosecutions,
14	sentencing and imprisonment of perpetrators of human
15	rights violations against Coptic Christians.
